JOB TITLE:	Head of Food Technology
REPORTS TO:	Assistant Principal (Academic)
MAIN PURPOSE:	<p>The Head of Food Technology will play a key strategic role in ensuring that food technology enriches the experiences of our pupils. This role will be responsible for the provision of an appropriately broad, balanced, relevant and differentiated curriculum in food technology, in accordance with the aims of the College.</p> <p>This role will lead food technology including planning, preparing and teaching all food technology lessons from Year 6 to Year 11</p>
HOURS OF WORK:	During College terms you shall work the hours while the College is in session and attend events including but not limited to staff meetings, one Easter revision session, INSET days, parents' evenings, open events and educational visits. All staff are expected to be on site until 5pm.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The following list is intended to give an indication of the range of duties and responsibilities attached to the post of Head of Food technology and does not attempt to specify all aspects of the role.

- Ensuring the provision of an appropriately broad, balanced, relevant and differentiated curriculum in food technology, in accordance with the aims of the College.
- Delivering of all elements of the food technology courses, including ensuring appropriate schemes of work are in place and that they are reviewed and revised regularly.

- Maintaining up-to-date records of attendance, assessment, planning, reports and communication with parents.
- Staying at the forefront of developments in the teaching of food technology and in education generally, and encouraging innovation in and beyond the classroom.
- Promoting creativity and a growing sense of independence amongst pupils.
- Placing weekly orders of ingredients and ensuring stock remains usable. Being responsible for day to day hygiene and cleaning between lessons.
- Prepare detailed reports on children's progress throughout the year.
- Organise GCSE or equivalent entries with the Examinations Officer and coordinate NEA assessments, including the internal assessment appeal process.
- Attend GCSE results day in order to liaise with parents and pupils and subsequently process potential re-marks, clerical checks and challenges to the boards, as deemed appropriate and necessary on the day, working closely with the Assistant Principal Academic.
- Produce an annual report and development plan with specific reference to GCSE or equivalent results as part of the annual departmental review process.
- Attend parents' evenings and options evenings and ensure appropriate departmental representation.
- Contribute subject specific information to the GCSE options booklets.
- Fostering a growth mindset ethos and love of learning by assisting and participating in a range of extension and enrichment activities for pupils.

SUPPORT FOR THE COLLEGE

- Uphold the College's policies relating to safeguarding and child protection, behaviour, health and safety and all other relevant policies.
- Promote and safeguard the welfare of all pupils at the College.

- Contribute to the College's ethos, aims and development/improvement plans.
- Attend and participate in regular meetings, as appropriate.

- Participation in the wider life of the College including being a form tutor and joining one of the houses.
- Participating in the wider school programme of co-curricular activities (leading 3 activities per week).
