# Job title: Computer Science Teacher

**Reporting to:** Head of Maths

**Hours of work:** 3 days per week

This is a part time role, worked over three days per week and all staff are expected to remain on site until 5pm. During College terms, you are required to work the hours during which the College is in session and attend events including, but not limited to, staff meetings, one Easter revision session, INSET days, parents' evenings, open events and educational visits.

**Main purpose:** Responsible for planning, preparing and delivering Computer Science across KS3 and KS4, ensuring effective curriculum coverage, high quality teaching, accurate assessment and strong pupil progress through engaging, well-structured lessons.

## Duties and Responsibilities

### Main Duties

- Ensuring the provision of an appropriately broad, balanced, relevant and differentiated curriculum for pupils studying Computer Science, in accordance with the policies and aims of the College
- Maintain up-to-date records of attendance, assessment, planning, reports and communication with parents
- Implementing differentiation strategies and monitoring their success
- Maintaining an up-to-date awareness of subject trends and pedagogy
- Regularly review schemes of work
- Encouraging the use of a wide range of resources within the department
- Maximising the potential of all students, through departmental activities, such as day trips and outside lectures
- Engage with professional development through courses and INSET
- Contribute subject specific information to the GCSE

- Attend staff meetings where appropriate, teach at least one Easter revision session per year and supervise at least two after school clubs per week.

### Responsibilities

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Our Computer Science department is a small but ambitious and forward looking part of the school.

Currently operating as a department of one, it offers a unique opportunity for a specialist to shape the direction, culture and curriculum of the subject. The postholder works closely with, and reports directly to, the Head of Maths, ensuring strong alignment with whole school approaches to numeracy, problem solving and academic standards.

Pupils enjoy a vibrant and well structured curriculum that builds confidence in programming, data handling, digital systems and the responsible use of technology. At GCSE, students are supported to develop sophisticated analytical

and coding skills that prepare them for further study in Computer Science and a wide range of digital pathways. Because the department is small, collaboration and creativity sit at its heart. The successful candidate will have the freedom to innovate, introduce new ideas, and lead cross curricular digital initiatives that enrich learning across the College. This role is ideal for someone who is both independent and team minded, ready to lead their subject while working closely with colleagues in Mathematics and beyond.
