From a young age, our junior pupils gain from specialist senior resources as well as from regular interaction and friendship with older pupils. In turn, our senior pupils become leaders and role models to our youngest children. Our learning community enables each member to grow and flourish.

We offer a broad and balanced curriculum, designed to develop a range of transferable skills and talents and to appeal to every interest. As they progress through the school, our children benefit from

Hours of work: 1 to 1.5 days per week

This is a part time role, worked over 1 to 1.5 days per week with availability required on Thursdays for the 2026/2027 academic year. All staff are expected to remain on site until 5pm. During College terms, you are required to work the hours during which the College is in session and attend events including, but not limited to, staff meetings, one Easter revision session, INSET days, parents' evenings, open events and educational visits.

Main purpose: Planning, preparation and delivery of allocated lessons for KS3 and KS4, ensuring effective curriculum coverage, high quality teaching, accurate assessment and strong pupil progress through engaging, well-structured lessons.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Plan and deliver engaging, challenging and creative Design & Technology lessons that develop pupils' practical skills, technical knowledge, creativity, independence and problem solving.
- Deliver a balanced, well sequenced and appropriately differentiated DT curriculum, ensuring pupils of all abilities, including SEND, can access learning and make strong progress.
- Uphold high standards of health and safety in all practical activities and ensure the effective organisation, preparation and maintenance of tools, machinery, materials and the DT workshop.
- Maintain up-to-date records of attendance, assessment, planning, reports and communication with parents
- Support improvements in attainment, behaviour, engagement and the overall quality of provision within the DT department and the wider College.
- Work with the Head of Department to review and develop schemes of work, resources and assessment materials, staying up to date with subject developments and encouraging innovation in and beyond the classroom.
- Contribute subject specific information to the GCSE options booklets and attend GCSE results day.
- Support, run and participate in trips and co-curricular activities fostering a growth mindset ethos and love of learning.
- Engage in ongoing CPD, INSET and subject specific training to maintain strong pedagogical and technical expertise
- Following Shoreham College policies and specifications.
- To maintain a high standard of behaviour within Shoreham College in accordance with the College policies.
- The welfare and safety of each child in the class.
- Willingness to participate in the wider life of the College including being a form tutor and joining one of the Houses.

- Specialist DT teacher holding a good honours degree and demonstrating excellent subject knowledge and teaching practice.
- Highly organised professional able to show strong organisational and administrative skills.
- Skilled workshop practitioner confident in operating workshop machinery and hand tools; experienced with CAD/CAM (3D printers, laser cutters, CNC), electronics, materials, and safe

practical processes.

- Strong understanding of health and safety, knowledgeable in risk assessments, machine maintenance, tool management, and maintaining a compliant, well organised DT environment.
- Committed classroom teacher willing and able to teach Design & Technology across all levels of the school and act as a role model to fellow professionals.
- Enthusiastic contributor motivated, committed, and actively engaged in the wider activities of the Department and the School.

About our DT Department

The Design and Technology Department is a vibrant and well-equipped space, encouraging creativity, practical skills, and innovation across Key Stage 2 to Key Stage 4.

Our workshop is fully set up for timber-based projects, providing pupils with hands-on experience in safe and engaging environments. Adjacent to the workshop, our design studio features PCs, 3D printers, and a laser cutter, enabling pupils to expand their knowledge of materials and develop proficiency in CAD/CAM processes and portfolio work.

From Year 5 through Year 11, pupils progressively build their skills and compile skills passports to track their

achievements. The range of projects is diverse and stimulating, covering textiles, polymers, graphics, and timber. Examples of standout pupils' work include CAM mechanisms in Year 5, canvas drawstring bags in Year 6, advent calendars in Year 7, veneered coasters in Year 8, fidget snakes in Year 9, and bag pressed plywood lamps in Year 10. These projects not only teach practical techniques but also encourage creativity, problem-solving, and independent thinking.

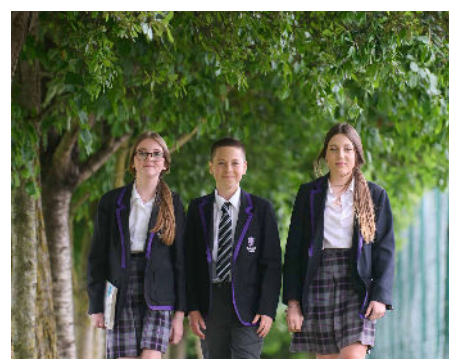
